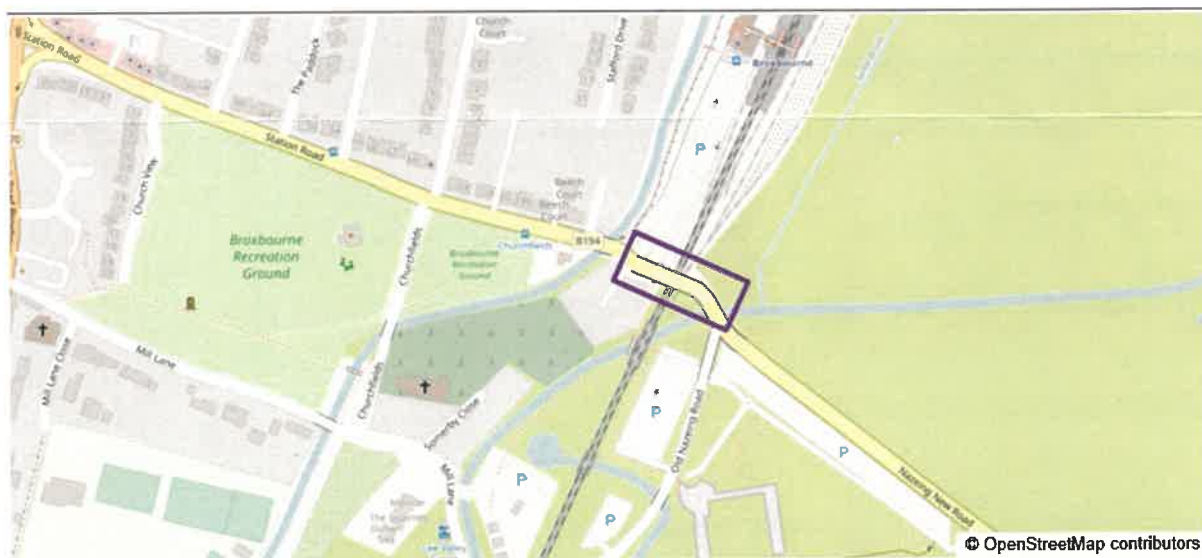

Dear Neighbour,

Our reference: BGK 17M 88yds / Bridge replacement work / Nazeing

As you may be aware from my previous letters, working with our contractor, J Murphy and Sons Ltd, we're planning to replace the central spans of Nazeing New Road, EN10. This is because these spans have now deteriorated beyond repair and need to be replaced to avoid permanent closure. This work will be carried out in the area shown below:



The proposed closure of Nazeing New Road bridge will take from Tuesday 3 January 2023 and will conclude on Sunday 30 April 2023. During this time, vehicle and pedestrian diversions will be in place. I have included maps of these below for your information.

The main work to demolish the existing spans and install new ones will take place from 13 to 18 January. During this time the railway will be closed. The railway will also be closed on 22 April for follow up works.

Alternative arrangements will be in place for passengers during these closures. Once confirmed, these will be advertised through the Greater Anglia and National Rail websites, as well as other journey planning apps.

You might remember that we previously proposed to close the bridge for over five months. Following feedback from the community on how disruptive this would be, we've reprogrammed the project so there's only a four month closure. I hope this is welcome.

I understand the bridge works and closure will nevertheless be disruptive to residents. We're still working with partners on a range of mitigation measures for pedestrian and vehicle diversionary routes. I'll be in touch again shortly regarding information events we'll be arranging to explain the works and mitigation methods in greater detail and answer your questions.

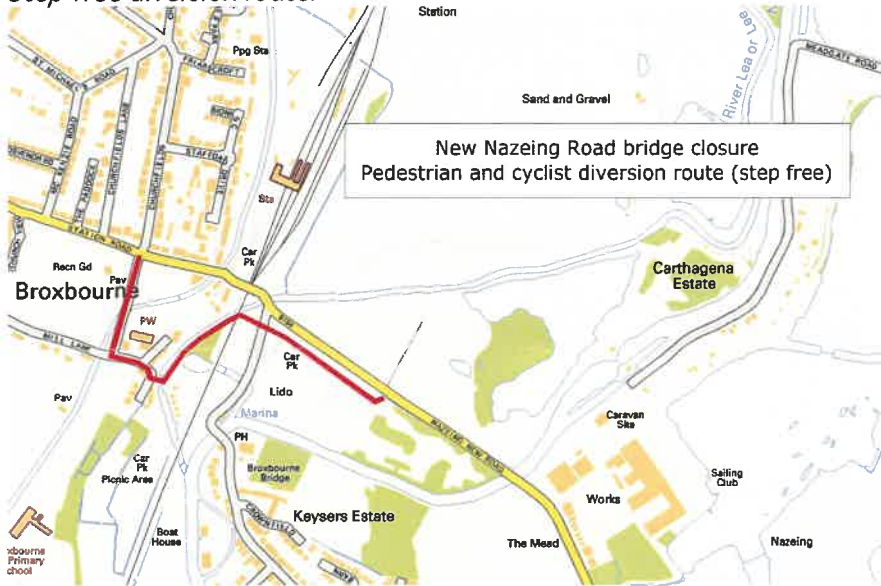
